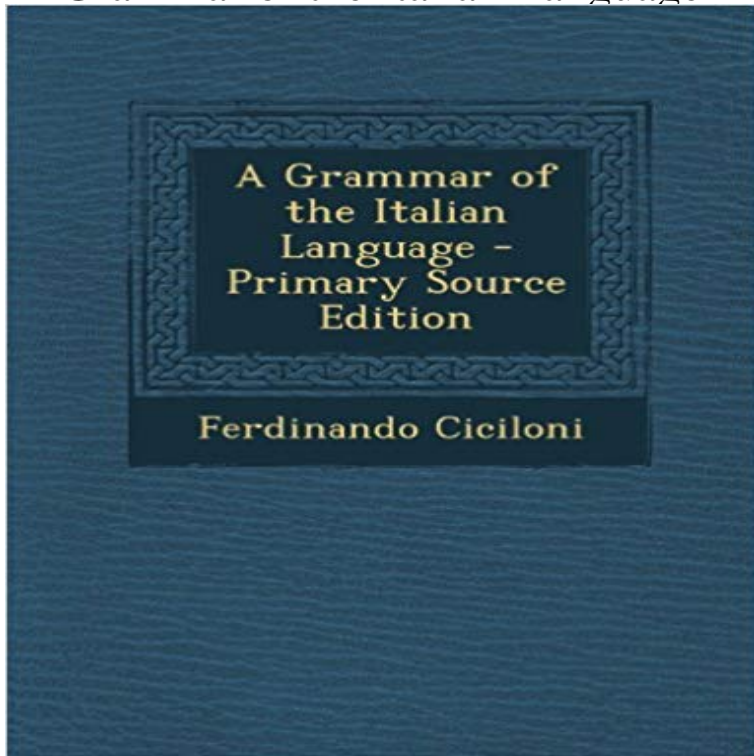


## A Grammar of the Italian Language
