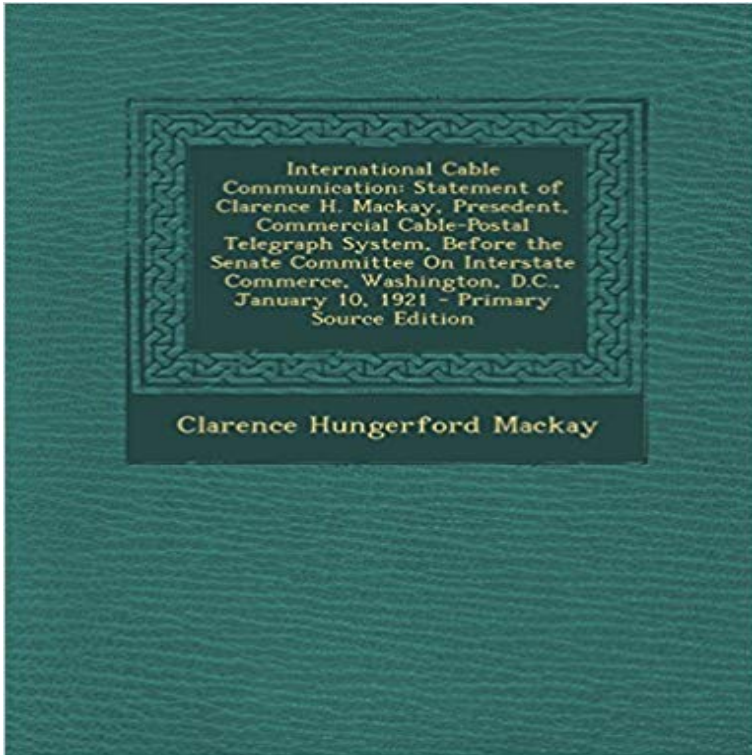


# International Cable Communication: Statement of Clarence H. MacKay, President, Commercial Cable-Postal Telegraph System, Before the Senate Committee O
